Jonathan Fanning is the author of several books, including *Who Are you BECOMING?* And has been coaching leaders from Fortune 500 companies to sole proprietors for over 15 years. If you are familiar with TED Talks, Jonathan was voted the best speaker at a recent TED conference. A traumatic car accident and several other “Frying Pan” moments in the middle of Fanning’s career as a management consultant to Fortune 500 companies triggered a quest for a deeper sense of purpose, meaning and significance. “Who are you Becoming? And “Who are you helping others Become?” became central to Jonathan’s life, businesses and speaking. He has also built several successful businesses including a national children’s fitness franchise and entrepreneur adventure which helps young people experience business start up and ownership. He has inspired and challenged audiences with his message in 49 states and on 3 continents. Jonathan lives in New York with his amazing wife and two angelic daughters.


Judi Lund Person, BA, MPH, CHC



Judi Lund Person has been the Vice President, Regulatory and Compliance for the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization since July 2002. Prior to joining the team at NHPCO, she served for 22 years as the President and CEO of The Carolinas Center for Hospice and End of Life Care. A recognized national leader in the field of hospice and end of life care, Lund Person works with hospice providers on regulatory and compliance issues, strategic planning, audits and fraud and abuse in hospice. Lund Person spearheaded the creation and launch of the NHPCO's Quality Partners, a national initiative designed to build organizational excellence and improve hospice and palliative care delivery and outcomes. Lund Person lends her regulatory expertise as a key contact with the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services, the Food and Drug Administration, Drug Enforcement Administration, and many other federal agencies. She also represents hospice and palliative care with many national organizations, including the National

Consensus Project for Quality Palliative Care. She graduated with honors with a BA degree in Sociology from the University of North Carolina at Greensboro and a Master's Degree in Public Health from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.




Kenneth J Doka, Ph.D

Dr Kenneth J Doka, is a Professor Emeritus, The College of New Rochelle and Senior Consultant to the Hospice Foundation of America. He is one of the authors of the text, *Dying and Death: Life Living*. A prolific author, Dr Doka's books include *Aging America: Coping with Loss*, *dying and death in later life*, *Transforming loss: Finding potential in loss*; *When Grief is complicated*, *Grief is a Journey: Finding your Pathway through Loss*, *Managing Conflict*, *Finding Meaning*, *Alzheimer's Disease and Dementia*, *Helping Adolescents Cope with Loss*, *Journey's with Grief: A Collection of Articles about Love, Life, and Loss*, *Improving Care for Veterans Facing Illness and Death*, *Ethics and End of Life Care*, *Beyond Kubler-Ross: New Perspectives on Death, Dying, and Grief*, *Spirituality and End of Life Care*; *Grieving beyond Gender: Understanding the Ways Men and Women Mourn*; *Counseling Individuals with Life Threatening Illness*; *Cancer and End of Life Care*; *Diversity and End of Life Care*; *Living with Grief: Children and Adolescents*, *Living with Grief: Before and After Death*, *Death, Dying and Bereavement: Major Themes in Health and Social Welfare* (a four volume edition) *Pain Management at the End of Life Care*: Dr Doka has published over 100 articles and book chapters.

Anne Monroe



Anne Monroe is an independent palliative practice consultant, and a palliative consultant for Bluegrass Care Navigators. Ms. Monroe was executive director of palliative care and manager of the physician practice at Bluegrass Care Navigators for over 18 years. She has worked in physician practice management for 25 years. Ms. Monroe is experienced in program planning, budgeting, system data analysis, regulatory compliance, operations, billing and coding, and other physician practice management tasks for palliative physician practices including the Bluegrass Care Navigators practice of 14 physicians and 14 nurse practitioners. She has presented numerous times at National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization (NHPCO) and Center to Advance Palliative Care (CAPC) national conferences, as well as regional conferences. Ms. Monroe is currently on the faculty of the CAPC Virtual Office Hours, addressing these formal topics: Community-Based Palliative Care Billing and Coding and Hospices Providing Community-Based Palliative Care. She received the Distinguished Leader Award in 2016 from the Kentucky Association of Hospice and Palliative Care. In addition, Ms. Monroe is coordinator of the University of Kentucky Hospice and Palliative Medicine fellowship. She earned her master's degree in health administration from the University of Kentucky.

Anita Ravi, MD, MPH, MSHP, FAAFP



Dr. Anita Ravi is a board-certified family medicine physician, public health researcher and nationally renowned expert in the area of gender-based violence and trauma-informed care. Dr. Ravi is the co-founder and CEO of the PurpLE Health Foundation, a non-profit organization that advances the health of communities by optimizing the physical, mental and financial health of women and girls who have experienced gender-based violence. From 2015 to 2019, she founded and directed “The PurpLE Clinic” in New York City – a pioneering primary care clinic for survivors of human trafficking and other forms of abuse and exploitation. Dr. Ravi has also authored multiple peer-reviewed publications in the areas of trauma, human trafficking and healthcare delivery in underserved settings. Her health and human rights work includes conducting forensic examinations for people seeking asylum and facilitating health education workshops for people who experience incarceration. Dr. Ravi currently serves as the Vice Chair of the American Medical Association’s Women Physicians Section Governing Council, and on the New York State Academy of Family Physicians’ Board of Directors. She regularly writes and speaks at events across the country on how the healthcare system must radically adapt to meet the needs of people who have experienced exploitation and abuse. Dr. Ravi is a graduate of Washington University in St. Louis, received her Medical Degree from the University of Michigan School of Medicine, her Masters in Public Health from Yale University and her Masters in Health Policy research from the University of Pennsylvania School of Medicine/Robert Wood Johnson Foundation Clinical Scholars Program. Allison Silvers is Vice President for Payment and Policy at the Center to Advance Palliative Care (CAPC). In this role, Ms. Silvers educates payers and policymakers on the value of palliative care and the strategies to be implemented, while educating palliative care programs. She has led the “Serious Illness Quality Alignment Hub” coordinating more than 40 organizations to define and pursue requirements and incentives for palliative care access and quality, including the co-creation of a toolkit for health care purchasers. She currently supports three “Learning Communities” for health plans, ACOs, and PACE programs, leading a series of meetings, webinars, coaching sessions, and resource-sharing to expedite adoption of key strategies that improve the care of people with serious illness.

Senator Greg McCortney

Senator McCortney is a member of the RNC. He serves District 13 in the Oklahoma State Senate. He was newly elected in 2016.
